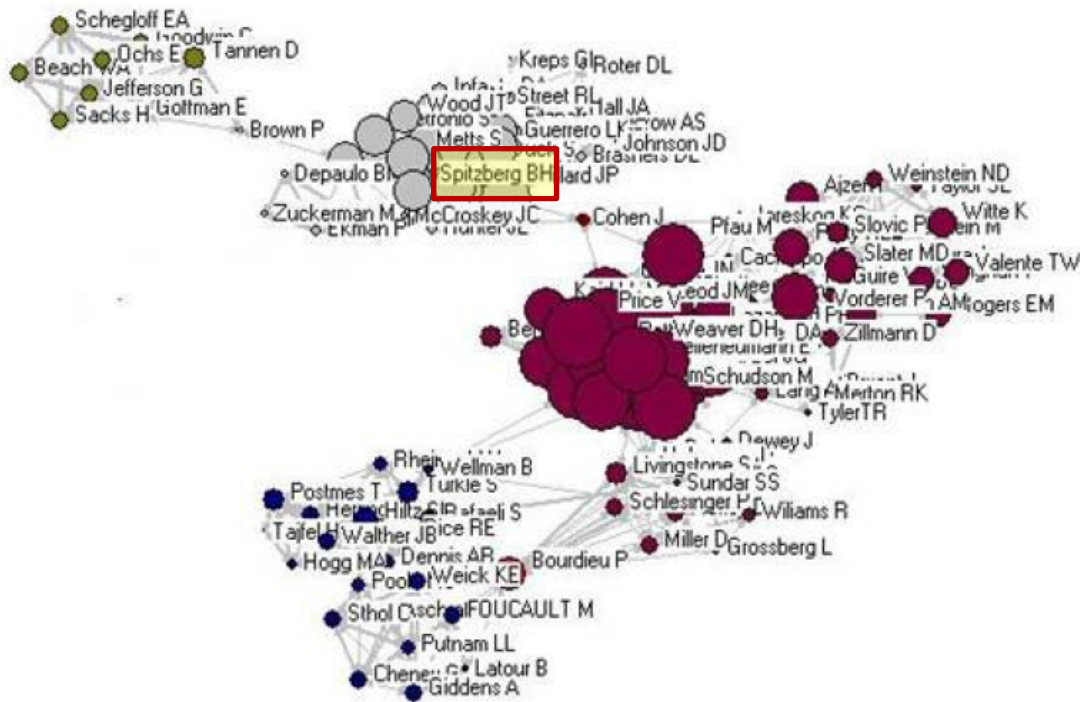


Figure 4. Network of Authors cocitation (ACA)
